





SHOOK & SMATHERS ARCHIVES

The Museum of Haywood County History is located in the oldest frame house west of the Blue Ridge, the Historic Shook-Smathers House (circa 1795). It is owned and operated by the Haywood County Historical and Genealogical Society. The museum features exhibits which help visitors explore life in the early 1800s, learn about unique communities dotting the scenic landscape of the county, discover the county's industrial heritage, realize the sacrifices and experiences of local military veterans, and experience the county's nationally recognized tradition of shaped-note singing. In addition, the museum contains Shook-Smathers family archives, and visitors can see Shook's Chapel on the third floor where local Methodism flourished, and circuit riding preacher Bishop Frances Asbury visited in 1810.
